SPECIAL ANTIQUE VEHICLE ASSOCIATIONS BULLETIN

New Law Will Effect the Display of Antique Vehicle Plates

Richmond — Vehicles displaying Virginia antique plates may display only one plate if the vehicle was designed to display a single plate.

In Virginia, a vehicle must be at least 25 years old to display an antique vehicle plate. The plates can be ordered through any Department of Motor Vehicles branch office for a one-time \$5.00 fee, and are valid until the vehicle changes ownership.

Antique and vintage plates may be used for transportation to or participation in a club activity, tour, parade, or similar event. They may also be used

when testing the vehicle's operation and when taking it for repairs or maintenance.

Vintage plates are those plates issued the same year as the car was manufactured. They may be found in junk yards or bought at yard sales, but must be registered at a DMV branch office for a one-time \$5.00 registration fee.

Communiplates, hobbyist plates, Great Seal plates and regular passenger vehicle plates authorize general use of your car, and may be issued in addition to antique or vintage plates.

A Communiplate is a reserved vehicle plate displaying any available combination of two to six letters and/or numbers.

Hobbyist plates can be issued to any reconstructed vehicle whose chassis is at least 20 years old, or any "specially constructed" vehicle.

Great Seal plates feature the state seal in the center with three numbers on the right and left. Reserved combinations are not available in this series.

Currently, there are 6,108 antique vehicles registered in Virginia.
