#### Shelby American Museum to Distribute Poster Featuring Shelby Automobile Collection

DALLAS — The Shelby American Museum today announced plans to distribute a first-of-its-kind poster featuring 31 original Shelby automobiles. Including a full range of Shelby designs, from the original Cobra to the latest Chrysler, the limited edition, full-color poster was available to the general public for the first time at the Shelby American Automobile Club Texas Regional Meet on September 19-20 in Dallas.

The automobiles, never before photographed as a group, were assembled from across the United States. Collectively valued in excess of \$5 million, the vehicles are the property of the Shelby American Museum in Dallas.

Among the 31 vehicles featured in the poster are the Cobra/CSX2000, the first Cobra ever produced, which is now valued at over \$1 million; two of the six existing Cobra Daytona Coupes; the first GT 350 Shelby Mustang ever produced; and a 1963 Falcon Panel Wagon, the original Shelby tow vehicle and trailer. The full-color poster also includes a photograph of Carroll Shelby himself with the same goggles he wore when he won at LeMans in 1959 driving an Aston Martin.

The poster will be distributed through the mail at a cost of \$25 plus \$5.00 postage and handling. Checks or money orders should be made payable to the Shelby American Museum, P.O. All of the cars featured in the poster, including several other Shelby designs, will be on display at the Shelby American Museum in Dallas, which is scheduled for completion in 1988.

"The museum is a non-profit, perpetual care institution, dedicated to the preservation of the legend and cars of Shelby American," said Rick Nagel, museum director and long time Shelby enthusiast. "The Shelby American Museum also will serve as the center of automobile club activity in the Southwest. Some of the Cobras and Shelby Mustangs will be driven in vintage races, and all will be continually maintained in the garage incorporated in the museum design."

According to current plans for the non-profit museum, approximately 70 vehicles will be on display at all times. In addition to those owned by the museum, some of the automobiles will be on permanent loan, some on consignment and others loaned by Nagel and Carroll Shelby.

More than 60 of the Shelby automobiles, from the original Cobras and Mustangs to the newest Chrysler designs, will be housed permanently at

the museum. An additional 10 vehicles, including such makes as the Ferrari, Mercedes and Porsche, will be placed on rotating displays. And a wide variety of Shelby-related memorabilia also will be available for public inspection.

In conjunction with the normal museum operations, the 1965 Cobra Caravan Semi-Tractor/Trailer will transport a sampling of Shelby vehicles to public exhibitions, automobile shows, vintage races and other special events around the nation. The same rig once toured the country after the Cobra brought the United States its only World Manufacturer's Championship in 1965.

Shelby-designed automobiles are among the fastest production automobiles ever offered to the general public. The Cobra, a two-seat, aluminum bodied, V-8 powered roadster, gained its reputation from 1962-1970 as it set either the fastest GT qualifying or fastest GT race lap in 26 of 27 races. In addition, the Cobra and Shelby Mustangs dominated the SCCA's A and B Production Classes from 1963-1970.

Shelby, a native Texan, is well known not only for his automobile designs, but his career as a race car driver. Shelby's automobiles have won



17 overall GT class wins, set 42 international records on the world's premier race courses, and inspired 23 national and international speed records at the Bonneville Salt flats.

The Saleen Sportrucks had their best finish yet in the Coors Racetruck Challenge with Steve Saleen, team owner and designer, finishing 3rd in his #20 and Pete Halsmer in the #19 finishing 6th after losing the lead due to an "altercation" with a Nissan and a subsequent flat tire.

The "Saleen March" through the South continued on to Memphis and to the brand new Memphis International Motorsports Park for the 6th round of Coors Racetruck Challenge on September 12 and 13.

Steve Saleen and Pete Halsmer returned to field #19 and #20 Saleen Sportrucks against the best of the imports. Nissan, Toyota and Jeep had proved to be the fiercest competitors for the Ford Ranger, but the "March through Georgia" kept up the steam through Tennessee and brought home a first win for Ford and General Tire in the all new Racetruck series.

The Saleen Sportrucks grabbed a 1-2 lead in the first turn and showed their off shore buddies the rear bumper view the remainder of the race.

Saleen Autosport, Ford, General Tire, and all the associate sponsors are appreciative of the support received by the team at every location across the country. We continue on the Mid-Ohio Sports Car Course for the second 24-hour race of the year. The heat is on!




#### When It Stops Being Fun
