Again in 1989, the Mustang Club of America will sponsor a National Points Championship.

How do you participate?

Simple. Send a note, along with your MCA membership number and a check for \$10, to MCA National Headquarters, P.O. Box 447, Lithonia, GA. 30058-0447. You must include the year, make, model, class and serial number of your Mustang.

By return mail, MCA will send you a National Points Card with your national points number and several forms. As you finish first, second or third at an MCA Grand National, MCA National, Regional MCA Show or any local show (World of Wheels, 55-57 Chevy Show, etc.) you fill out the form and have the local head judge sign it. You then return it to MCA. MCA keeps track of the totals of all national points championship competitors and, at the end of the show season, awards a handsome certificate to the National Points Champion for 1989, denoting your show class. Points are awarded in the following manner:

1989 Grand National Show

First Place, 30 Points Second Place, 25 Points Third Place, 20 Points

1989 MCA National Show

First Place, 25 Points Second Place, 20 Points Third Place, 15 Points

1989 MCA Regional Group or Local Show

First Place, 15 Points Second Place, 10 Points Third Place, 5 points

1989 Non-MCA Show

First Place, 5 Points Second Place, 3 Points Third Place, 2 Points

Look for the points leader listings in future issues of The Mustang Times.

The season runs from Jan. 1, 1989 through Nov. 5, 1989. Deadline for signing up for the MCA National Points Championship is May 1, 1989.
