

Mustang Corral Underway At Watkins Glen

Ford Motor Company, in conjunction with three New York area Mustang Clubs, is in the process of building a Mustang Corral to serve as a showcase for all Mustangs.

The corral will be located at Watkins Raceway in Watkins Glen, NY. It will serve as a place for Mustang lovers from throughout the country to meet and share their interest in the pony car, according to the sponsors.

The corral will be enclosed with a split-rail fence and a drive-through facade will sport the Mustang logo. Future plans also include a hospitality tent. Family camping is available close to the site.

A temporary corral has already hosted several events this past year. A Mustang display was featured during the Camel Continental Weekend and the Rochester Shelby Club held its second annual speed event at the corral. Approximately 75 cars participated in that event.

During the weekend of Aug. 12-13 more than 100,000 fans participated in Budweiser at the Glen and a Mustang parade lap was featured. Another display was planned for Sept. 9-10 during Serengeti weekend.

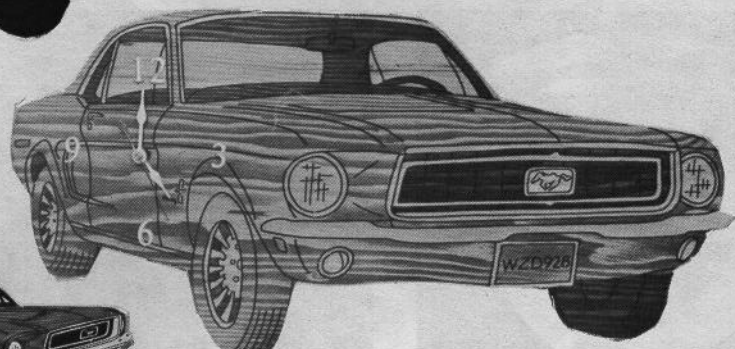
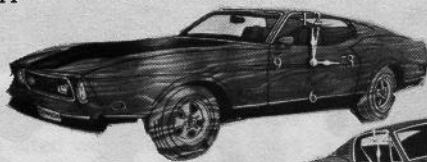

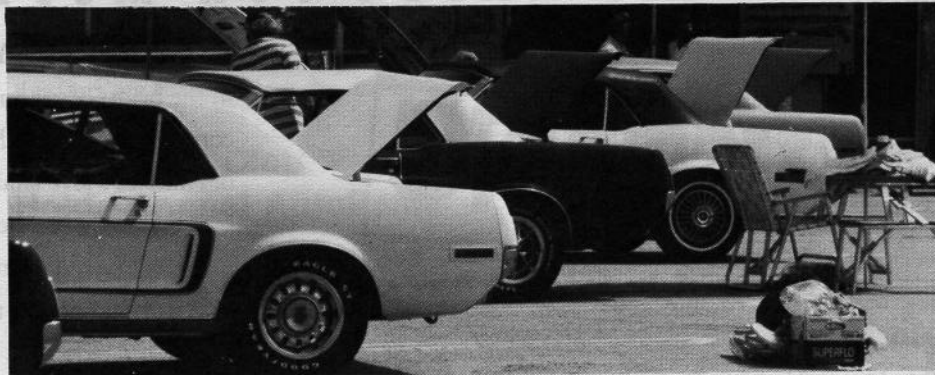
Venders were on hand to supply parts, and in some cases, entertainment. Joe Antrican of A&A Mustangs will probably be in the remote control car hall of fame!
