MCA Standard Judging Test Is Undergoing Revisions

MCA's standard judging test, which must be successfully completed by all certified judges, is currently being revised, according to National Head Judge Bob Perkins.

We are now in the process of rewriting the entire standard judging test, and I can promise you it will be much more difficult when

we finish."

Perkins says "as the quality and authenticity of show cars continues to improve it becomes necessary to make certain that all our certified judges are qualified to make the increasingly critical evaluations required by competition."

An increase in both national and regional shows using official MCA rules has also resulted in the demand for additional cer-

tified judges.

This has been our busiest year ever in terms of national MCA shows, and this being the anniversary year of the Mustang, the number of regional shows has also increased. It also seems that more groups are going to our official judging rules as the basis for competition in their local shows."

To become a certified MCA judge, MCA members must take a written test, which is available by sending a stamped, selfaddressed envelope to Perkins at North 3183 Highway 26, Juneau, WI 53039.

Each test is keyed to a specific model year as defined in the MCA rule book.

Completed tests are returned to Perkins for scoring. Those who successfully complete the test receive an official MCA judging card and a certificate.

Experienced judges can also become Gold

Card Judges.

To become a Gold Card Judge, the member must obtain a letter of recommendation from two other Gold Card Judges who are members of different regional groups from the applicant and who have judged with the prospective Gold Card Judge at MCA sanctioned events.

Gold Card Judges serve as team leaders of judging crews at national and grand national MCA meets. Their names are also listed periodically in The Mustang Times.

"This allows people who are restoring cars to call a knowledgeable individual for help and advice.

By becoming a Gold Card Judge you are making a real commitment to the hobby," Perkins says. You're telling us that you are really interested in bettering the sport.

Perkins says those who are interested in becoming Gold Card Judges should be aware that they will receive numerous calls from other MCA members seeking advice on specific steps in the restoration process.

"It does demand some time. Often Gold Card Judges have to respond to questions by letter after doing some research. If you want to be a part of this program you can expect to get some picky and difficult questions."

But Perkins feels the Gold Card system can be instrumental in improving the quali-

ty of competition cars:

The Gold Card Judges system can only be as good as the Gold Card Judges want to make it. The people involved must be conscientious and willing to work with others to make our cars and our rules better."
