The Cajun Mustangers, a group which only received its MCA charter a year ago, will stage a national show at the air-conditioned Lake Charles, LA civic center.

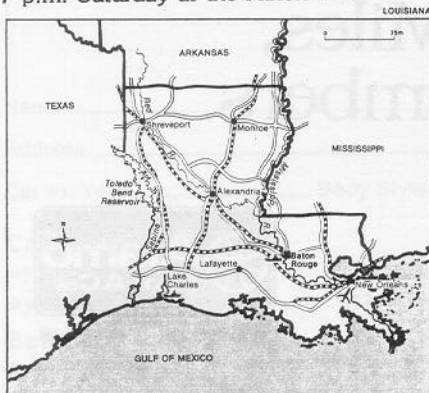
The group enjoyed tremendous success with its first show in 1989, raising enough money to give away a brand new Mustang as its show prize.

Judging will continue from 9 a.m. until noon Sunday and an awards ceremony will close the show Sunday afternoon. The trophy presentation will be held at the Lake Charles Civic Center.

LAKE CHARLES, LA. Population 75,226* city/170,000 metro area.

ACCESS: Interstate 10.

HISTORY: The history of Lake Charles is steeped in tales of pirates and buried treasure and began with the arrival of French settlers in the 1760's. But head for the downtown Charpentier Historic District where the source of the city's wealth — the timber industry — is evident in the use of solid pine and cypress in construction of the district's fine homes.

ATTRACTIONS: Imperial Clacasiu Museum, 204 West Sallier, Lake Charles. An excellent introduction to Cajun Country with an extensive collection of historic memorabilia.
