1990 National Judges Meeting Scheduled

The Mustang Club of America's annual judges' meeting will be held October 19-21 in Juneau, WI, MCA National Head Judge Bob Perkins has announced.

The meeting will be held at Perkins' Restorations and is open to all MCA members who wish to attend.

At the 1990 meeting, rules changes for the 1991-92 show season will be considered and rules changes adopted at the meeting will be incorporated into a revised judging rule book to be issued before the 1991 season begins.

MCA rules changes are adopted only every two years, although national judges' meetings are held annually. The official MCA rule book is printed only once each two years.

"We invite all MCA members who are interested in discussing specific rules or proposing changes in the organization's rules to attend this meeting and voice their opinions," Perkins said. "Any member who has a problem with our current rules or has sug-

gestions for improving our judging system should be present to participate, to propose changes and to vote."

MCA President Charles Hampton of Anderson, SC also urged all MCA members to participate in the judges' meeting.

"The rules that are adopted at the October judges' meeting will be binding on all of us for two years. I want to see as many of our members as possible participate in this meeting so that we have a consensus when new rules are approved. The majority rules and what the majority decides at the October meeting will be our official policy for the 1991 and 1992 show seasons."

Hampton said a number of regional groups are considering chartering buses to transport members to Juneau for the meeting.

"We have heard of numerous groups who are considering chartering buses to Wisconsin for the meeting and I encourage any group concerned about our national judging rules to consider that as an option. We want

as many people as possible to participate in this process."

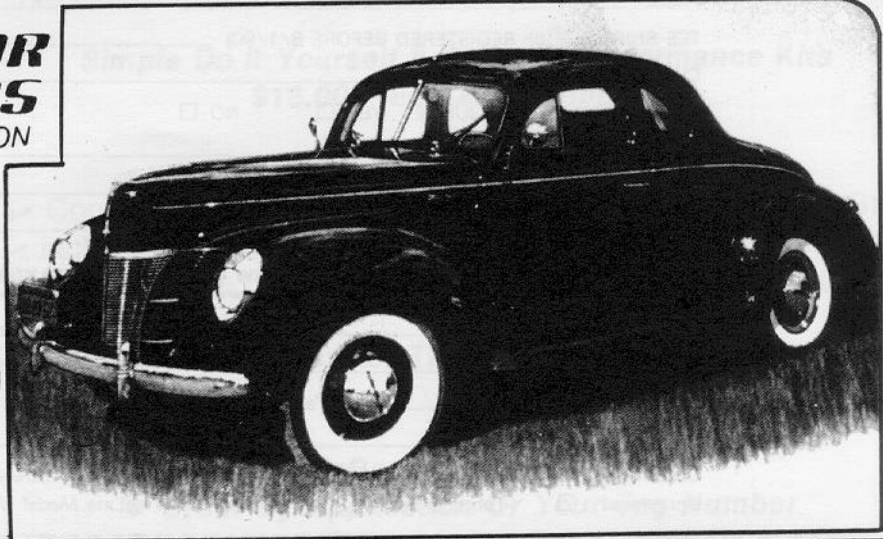
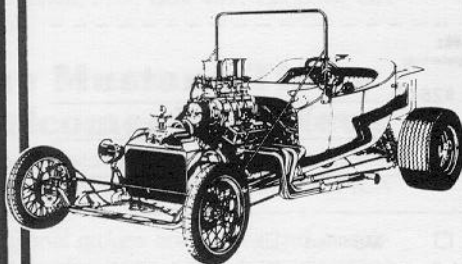
Controversy over proposed changes requiring some "orange peel" in paint on restored Mustangs has sparked a great deal of interest in this year's meeting.

"This is where the orange peel issue will be decided," Hampton said, "and, as with all our rules, the majority will prevail. I urge any and all MCA members interested in the orange peel debate to come be a part of the 1990 rules meeting."

"We will have some specific information about lodging and transportation in the September issue of *The Mustang Times*, he added.

Hampton also urged MCA members who cannot attend the judges' meeting to submit any pertinent comments regarding the club's official rules in writing prior to the meeting.
