

# Committee Chairpersons Named For 1994 Convention

Jim Osborn, show chairman for the Mustang Club of America's newly announced 30th Anniversary Mustang Convention, has selected six members of the national organization's Board of Directors to serve as committee chairpersons for the planning of the 1994 event.

Osborn has named Bob Deale, Charles Hampton, Don Perry, Ricky Simmons, Teresa Vickery and Bruce Weiss to assist him in preparations for what is expected to be the largest Mustang event ever held.

The 30th Anniversary Convention will be held at Charlotte Motor Speedway in Charlotte, NC April 15-17, 1994. MCA previously announced an agreement with the world famous speedway to serve as host site for the convention. MCA will be the primary sponsor of the event.

Osborn said each of the six committee chairpersons will be assigned duties in the very near future. Each is expected to assume responsibility for one specific area of the show and to select additional volunteers to help in the planning and implementation of the convention.

Osborn and Weiss attended the annual convention of the Specialty Equipment Manufacturers Association (SEMA) held in Las Vegas in November. The two MCA board members met with a number of potential sponsors — including Ford Motor Company, Dobbs Publishing, Petersen Publications, Goodyear Tires, McQuire's Car Care Products, Paxton Superchargers, The Wax Shop, Vortech Superchargers and others — to discuss plans for the MCA-sponsored celebration.

The show chairman said he expects to have announcements about confirmed sponsors for the Anniversary Convention in the coming months.

Press releases announcing the 30th Anniversary Convention have been sent to all media and numerous other companies and groups who might be interested in participating in the event.

The Mustang Club of America's Board of Directors authorized negotiations with Charlotte Motor Speedway regarding a possible 30th Anniversary Convention in the fall of this year. Subsequent meetings with speedway representatives resulted in an agreement between MCA and the speedway's owners to host the birthday celebration.

Plans for the event are continuing, but it has already been announced that the convention will include a car show, swap meet and open track event.

manufacturers' tent and a seminar tent, where presentations will be offered almost continuously during the three-day event.

April 17, 1994 marks the 30th anniversary of the introduction of the Ford Mustang. The Charlotte convention is being planned as the nation's premiere celebration of that day in automotive history.

All MCA's 100-plus regional groups will be invited to participate in the convention, though specifics about the nature of that participation have not yet been finalized.

"MCA envisions this 30th Anniversary Convention as the biggest single event in the

history of the Mustang, and I am proud to be able to announce that these six experienced, dedicated board members will be assisting in the planning and execution of this convention," Osborn said.

"We anticipate this will be the largest gathering of Mustangs in the 30 year history of the car, and all of us on the committee are excited about the tremendous possibilities this opportunity presents."
