A word on another insurance matter.

As most of you know, MCA Regional Groups are eligible for insurance coverage under an umbrella policy carried by the national organization.

Many of our regional clubs have taken advantage of this coverage in the past for their local shows.

The coverage is still available, and I consider this one of the most valuable services offered by MCA.

However, MCA is now required to submit requests for coverage in writing before a binder is issued, and this requires some additional time for processing at our national headquarters.

Regional groups interested in taking ad-

vantage of this benefit from MCA are urged to submit their requests four to six weeks prior to a scheduled show to assure that a binder can be forwarded to your club by your show date.
