Mid-Ohio Valley Group Hears Program On Paint

A representative of PPG Industries presented an illustrated lecture on automotive paint to members of the Mid-Ohio Valley Mustang Club recently.

Danny Wilde of PPG told the MCA Regional Group that individuals without painting permits may not be able to purchase and apply spray paint to their cars in the future. He explained that ongoing efforts to

stop the depletion of the ozone layer may result in future Environmental Protection Agency regulations which effectively prohibit do-it-yourselfers from purchasing and using automotive paints.

Wilde also said such regulations could also work a hardship on smaller restoration shops and might well put some of them out of business, leaving only large shops with the finances to purchase expensive, environmentally-safe equipment to serve the needs of the restoration market.

The presentation on automotive paint was organized by Mid-Ohio Valley Mustang Club President Russ Weiss.

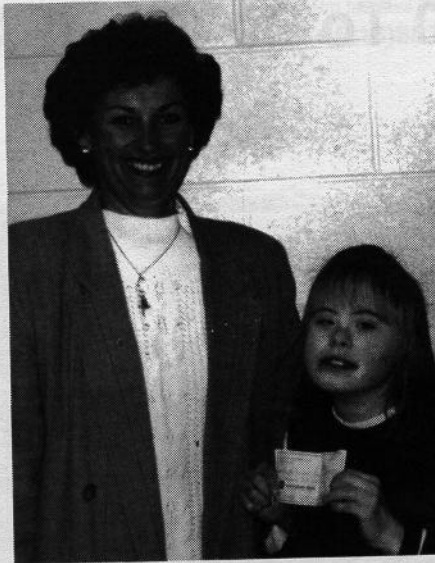
