4th Generation Mustang Facts

The Mustang assembly plant has a production line that's nine miles long! This line is housed in a building that's just one mile long, but three stories high. This assembly line snakes back and forth and reaches all three floors to make up its nine mile length.

The fourth generation Mustang requires 2007 welds during its assembly process.

Once the three main body sections are welded together, 44 different cameras projecting laser beams check the body for perfect alignment.

The new Mustang is offered in three different versions of the color red.

The time required for the entire painting process is three hours. The paint is 'baked' on in a 280 degree oven.

The Mustang convertible is made up of 2800 parts. That count is 300 more than coupes. Most of the convertible's additional parts are top mechanisms and frame strengthening items.

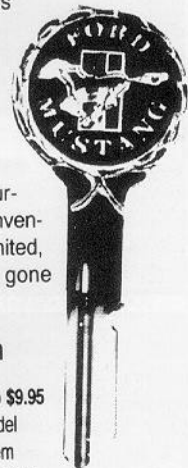
One third of all Mustangs are sold as convertibles.
