What better way is there to spend a Friday evening in Georgia than to be picking insects out of your grill. Congratulations to Bob on his trophy. "Right on Brother"!

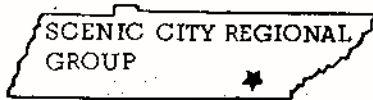
