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### TYING THINGS TOGETHER

At several auto shows, non-Mustang and Mustang related, I have seen a few very original belt buckles. So a short time ago, I decided to make an original "Mustang" belt buckle. The ideal logo to start from is the glove box emblem from the 1966 model. Another logo is one from the door panels of the deluxe interior of a 1969 Mustang. So I ran to my local Ford dealer only to find both were no longer available...

But, upon leaving, I saw a Mustant II and there on the inside door panel was the logo I needed. The part number is as follows:  
D4ZZ-6920802-A

After getting the part, I went to a local leather shop where i purchased a blank belt buckle. The owner assured me that these blank buckles can be had readily all over the country so no one should have any problem.

Affixing the horse was no problem. Two holes were drilled in the buckle and the horse inserted. The extra length of the pins was cut off and the rest was peened over forming a rivet head.

That is it, simple, inexpensive and original.
