



Detroit FDA and ASC to Build Dream Cruise Mustang

The Detroit (Michigan) Ford Dealer Advertising Association and ASC Incorporated have joined forces to build 65 Ford Mustang Woodward Dream Cruise special edition vehicles.

The Dream Cruise Mustangs will be offered in coupe and convertible models. Each vehicle, including the 17" aluminum wheels shod with 245/45 ZR Goodyear tires, will be painted in ZR Ultra White. In addition, the Dream Cruise Mustangs will carry a specially tuned Borla exhaust system exiting out the side and stowed behind a SVO exhaust rocker cover with matching side body scoops. Razor Blue stripes will decorate the

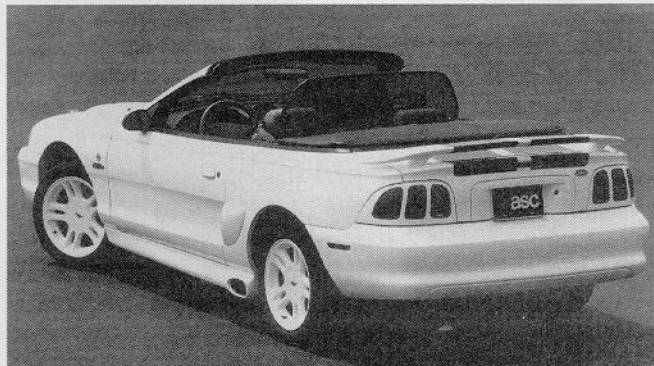
hood and the decklid, accented by a set of retro-style, simulated hood pins. The interiors will be factory Medium Graphite. Specific Woodward Dream Cruise nomenclature will appear on the front quarters and interior of the vehicle.

"The Woodward Dream Cruise has grown into a spectacular motoring event," said Richard J.

Bartus, director of advertising, Ford Dealer Advertising Association. "The Mustang has a 33 year history cruising Woodward Avenue and we wanted to commemorate the Dream Cruise in '97 with a special edition package."

The Woodward Dream Cruise Mustangs have been available at participating Metro Detroit Ford Dealers since August 1.

ASC Incorporated was charged with the design and prototype of the Woodward Dream Cruise Mustangs. ASC will employ its low volume build system and assemble the limited edition Mustangs at its Technical Center



headquarters in Southgate, Michigan.

Special equipment includes ZR Ultra White exterior paint, ZR Ultra White 17-inch aluminum wheels, hood and decklid stripe package, simulated hood pins, Borla exhaust, Ford SVO rocker exhaust cover, body side scoop, '97 Woodward Dream Cruise nomenclature, Medium Graphite interior, windstop on convertibles only.
