Proposed Change to MCA ByLaws

From time to time it is deemed necessary to clarify or possibly change a portion of the bylaws which govern the Mustang Club of America. These proposed changes must go the committee route before being presented to the Board of Directors.

After discussions, and if there are no recommendations for additional changes, the proposal is voted upon. Then it is voted on again at the next Board of Directors meeting. In other words there are no snap decisions made when it comes to the rules and regulations that govern this organization.

The following changes were proposed at the October 14, 1997 Board meeting. These are presented to you for your information.

Article V Board of Directors

Section 2. Vacancies: A vacancy shall be deemed to exist in the case of the death, resignation or removal of any Director, or if the authorized number of Directors be increased by amendment of these By-Laws and the Articles of Incorporation. A vacancy or vacancies shall be filled by the remaining Directors or by the members at an annual or special meeting of the Active members entitled to vote. (*The following portion is being added.*) *When remaining Directors are filling vacancies, the top candidates, in descending order, not elected on the previous annual ballot, must first be placed in nomination and voted on by the Directors. When, and if, this list is exhausted, nominations will be taken (continued on page 56)

(continued from page 2) and voted on accordingly. In the event the number of vacancies precludes the formation of a quorum, a simple majority of remaining Directors, including proxies, will prevail in the nomination and election process.* Such member or members so elected shall hold office for the term of the Director replaced, and until the successor is qualified and elected.

Section 9. Quorum: Two-thirds (2/3) of the Board of Directors and/or Officers, excluding Regional Group National Directors, shall be necessary to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, except to adjourn as hereinafter provided.
