# Northeast Georgia Mustang Club Tanger Show Roundup

The 9th Annual Northeast Georgia Mustang Show and Shine was well represented in almost every class. Enthusiasts gathered at the Tanger Outlet Center in Commerce, Georgia, with cars representing every era of the Mustang's 33 years in production including early and late variations as well as Mustang IIs, Shelbys, Bosses, Saleens, Cobras, and modifieds. Out of 63 cars on hand, there were 14 convertibles and six coupes, with the remaining num-

ber made up of fastback or hatchback models.

The Special Interest class was a delight as well and included a 1957 Thunderbird, two Cougars, a T-bucket, and a 1956 Ford convertible.

First, second, and third place trophies, sponsored by Mustang Parts Specialities and Dugan Racing, were awarded in 25 classes.

WJJC radio in Commerce supplied a remote set up and provided music and live reports from the show site resulting in an unusually large amount of spectator traffic.

WJJC and Tanger Outlet Center awarded Best of Show to Larry Graham of Belton, South Carolina, for his beautiful 1969 Mach 1.
