Dear Editor:

I just read the article on the valve cover gasket installation (June '79) and would like to add the following "helpful hint". (alas, to have a dime for every gasket that has slipped out of place just before the last bolt was in—I'd have enough for the down payment on the GT-350 I've always wanted!!!)

Helpful Hint: Before placing the valve cover onto the cylinder head, sneak into the nearest sewing basket and liberate a spool of common sewing thread (a color to match your car is nice but not necessary). Run a piece of thread through each hole in the gasket and valve cover and tie the gasket LIGHTLY to the valve cover at each hole. Now place the valve cover onto the cylinder head and insert the bolts. Before tightening the bolts, simply snip the sewing thread, pull it out and throw it away. Oh, yes. Don't forget to tighten the bolts.
