Our 1969 Mustang GT convertible was born in Dearborn on February 25, 1969. She is Wimbledon white, with a White power top, and White interior. She has an FMX transmission driven by a 351-2v and is loaded with a tilt-away steering wheel, deluxe interior decor group, selectair air conditioner, tinted glass, AM/FM stereo, exterior decor group and visibility group. She was originally sold to Philco Ford Corp. Blue Bell in Philadelphia as an executive car. According to Kevin Marti, she is one of 1,127 with the GT equipment group and 1 of 51 with these paint and trim codes.

We had previously owned a 1969 Shelby GT500 and wanted a rare Mustang convertible, loaded, preferably a Southern car with a documented history. We found Triplewhite in Mesa, Arizona. After trucking her to Canada

she underwent a restoration to MCA Driven Concours standards. We are showing her in MCA Driven Concours and at some local shows where she has done rather well. Triplewhite has earned a Silver at the MCA National show in Erie in 2006 plus several awards in local shows. We look forward to showing her in future MCA shows, particularly in 2008 in Toronto."
