We must see to the growth and expansion of this element of MCA, but we must expand our horizons to growing track events and relating to other Mustang groups. New Mustang models will be forthcoming, as well as developments with the modified and restomod car owners.

We must see to the growth of the Mustang Club of America. And, we must continue to keep a strong control of the budget to support our membership. The dream for growing our MCA, by our new president Steven McCarley, is right on target. More power to him, and our new Board of Directors.

The leadership of the MCA comes from all walks of life, and all parts of the country. Over the years, I find that they have been skilled in business and wise in problem solving. They have taken on extra loads, while counting their personal costs to travel to Board meetings.
