I would like to get some assistance from those of you at the Mustang Times or from your readers.



They matched it to their data base and determined the color and paint code-Purple Metallic M3203-A. So, Tused that information in the body restoration and painting. We took the car down to the metal and using the Ford paint code, brought it back up to its present condition. I've yet to meet anyone at Mustang shows and elsewhere that ever saw a '67 Mustang painted that color. I think it's a beautiful car-as does everyone else that sees it. The interior and motor are original.

Now to my request: The Marti Report indicates that the "Order Type" is Fleet. I would like to know how I might go about getting to the bottom of what leet it was a part of, if any, or anything else concerning the car and its unique color. The report also shows there there were 5,736 '67 Mustangs made that color.
