## LISTING YOUR CLUB'S EVENTS ON THE MCA WEBSITE AND IN *MUSTANG TIMES*

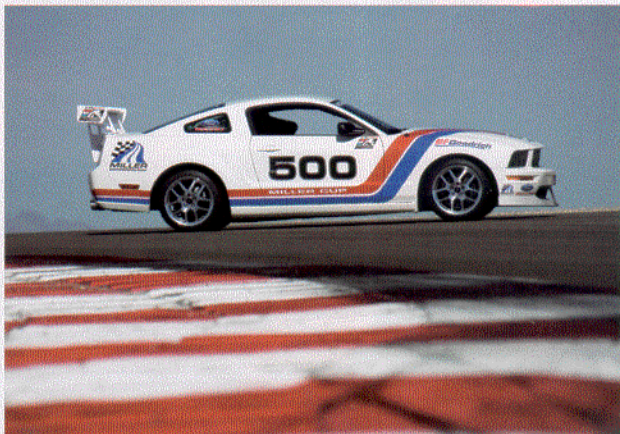

Also, if you want to have your website linked to the event on the MCA website listing, you must type the <http://> prior to the [www.](http://) address for your site if it doesn't show on the form. Also, if you do not include your web address, as it is optional, it will NOT automatically appear as a link on the MCA site. If this is all way too confusing, just go into the events listings, fill in all the pertinent information, and don't leave out any vital information.

One last note, events are copied monthly for inclusion in the magazine's listings. How far out the listings show up in *Mustang Times* depends on how many pages are available for that particular month, and how many events are close to the publishing date.
