n September 13, 2009, the Tara Mustang Club hosted our 4th Annual Tara Mustang Club/ Summit Racing Equipment Mustang & All Ford Show at Summit Racing Equipment in McDonough, Georgia. Our club members worked hard stuffing the goody bags. Members Dave Williams, Leonard Archer, and Kenny Newcombe designed 35 trophies plus two special Sponsor's Choice Early and Late Model Mustang awards. Each reg-

istrant received a specially designed participant plaque for entering. Summit Racing also sponsored a "Kids Choice" award, where age 15-and-under kids picked their favorite car. The club also had a silent auction and a 50/50 drawing to help raise additional funds for our charity, the Georgia Baptist Children's Home in Palmetto, Georgia. The ladies of our club did their usual outstanding job with the registration and the auction. Emily Williams once again used her abundant charm selling tickets for the 50/50 and the auction.
