Twenty-year-old NASCAR phenom Colin Braun brought award-winning musician and actress Queen Latifah a 2010 Ford Mustang and schooled her in how to drive the iconic muscle car like a pro. Latifah, already a proud owner of a '65 Mustang, wished to drive the car in the extended music video for her new song "Fast Cars."

"There are certain cars throughout history that have their own identity. They become synonymous with feeling and energy, an event in your life," says Latifah. "A Mustang is a Mustang; the car is timeless."

Latifah received her pro driving lesson and 2010 Mustang by participating in "The '10 Unleashed" promotion, which asks people to describe their ultimate Mustang dream experience in 250 words or less.

On June 24, 2009, Latifah took a detour from promoting her new album to head to New Jersey Motorsports Park, where Colin Braun and the 2010 Mustang were waiting for her. "Are you ready," Braun asked. Latifah held on tight while Braun white-knuckled her through a few hot laps. Latifah then proclaimed, "It's time to conquer this track," donned her own helmet and went out to experience the raw power and handling of the new 2010 Ford Mustang.

"I've been a little jealous of people riding around town with their Mustangs," Latifah said. "Now I got one. No more jealousy. They can eat my dust."

**VISUALLY IMPAIRED MAN UNLEASHES HIS 'INNER MUSTANG'**

With the warm Arizona wind pelting his forehead and his entire body vibrating from the mighty roar of the engine, Roger Keeney took a brand new 2010 Ford Mustang convertible on an amazing ride, doing donuts on the pavement and amassing speeds of up to 90 mph.

This would be a thrill for anybody but what makes this truly remarkable is that fact that 62-years-old Roger Keeney has been blind for the past 20 years.

Roger, who lives in Athens, GA, won the chance to drive the new 2010 Mustang by participating in "The '10 Unleashed" promotion, which asked people to describe their ultimate Mustang dream experience in 250 words or less.

"When I got the phone call from Ford saying that I had won, I thought someone was playing a joke on me," said Roger, who lost his sight in a farming accident.

It was definitely not a joke, says Ford Car Communications Manager Patricia Piedrahita.

"Without a doubt, his essay caught our attention," she said. "His submission hinted that he may be blind, so we had to talk to him to learn more. Upon speaking to him we knew he would help us see the Mustang from a different point of view."



On May 7, 2009, Ford flew Roger to the expansive Ford Proving Grounds just outside of Phoenix, AZ. With safety their number one concern, the Mustang team arranged for former professional racer Tommy Kendall to ride shotgun.



Roger recalled, "Tommy said, 'When you were a teenager, did you ever do donuts?' And I said, 'Yeah.' So I got it rolling a bit in first gear, cranked it hard to the left and revved it up and popped it and did three donuts before we stopped. When we stopped, we could hear the camera crew cheering from clear across the field. I was in awe of both the car and the experience—it was a dream come true.

"The most life-changing thing you can do for folks with disabilities is put them in a situation that everyone else has told them is impossible. The experience for me in the Mustang with Tommy Kendall next to me and driving that wonderful automobile was really great," Roger added.
