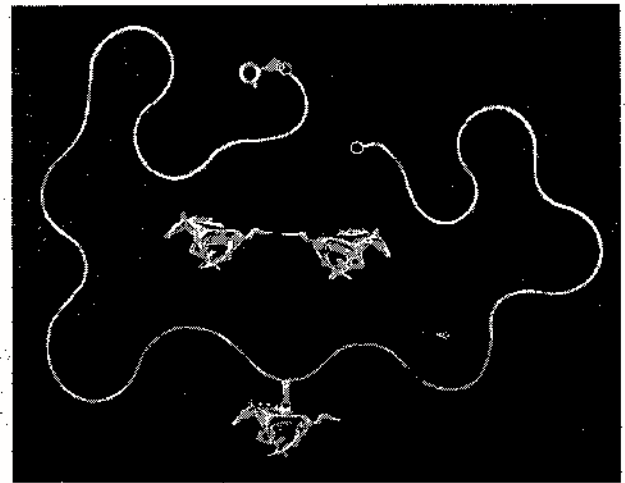
Five new regional groups were presented to the board for acceptance by Horace Wood, national regional group coordinator. We wish to extend a "heartly welcome" to the following groups:
