The passing score for all tests is seventy percent. To study for these tests we recommend the wide range of books and literature available. The tests primarily came from the most popular books and the questions are the type that most people who own a car could answer. If you have taken a test in the past and have not yet received your judging card and certificate, drop me a note and we will try to locate the problem.

This will enable Craig to organize his judges ahead of time instead of waiting until the last minute for judges (hopefully!) to show up. Also at Columbia, we will start recording all the Senior Division car serial numbers. We have a partial list but we need them all. If you have a Senior Division car and will not be at Columbia, please send me your name, year, model, and serial number so we can maintain the file on these cars.
