Jim Osborn made a report on Dixie National in Birmingham, Alabama. He said that the show seemed to be very successful and very well planned. It was suggested that a letter be sent from the national headquarters to the Birmingham group in appreciation for a job well done. Horace Wood said the Birmingham show was a great success and they appreciated the help from everyone.

Two petitions were presented for the Grand National for 1982. One from the Scenic City Regional Group in Chattanooga, Tennessee, and the other from the First Pennsylvania Regional Group in Allentown, Pennsylvania. After much discussion, A. W. Amanns made a motion that the Grand National for 1982 be awarded to the First Pennsylvania Group, seconded by Jim Osborn, voted on, and approved.

Discussion was brought on the floor about Frank Petty returning the second place trophy for Clarence Callier during the awards banquet. This was very disruptive and caused much confusion. Tom Gattis, parliamentarian, read Article VII, Section 5 of the by-laws, which follows:

#### Suspension, Expulsion, Reinstatement by Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors shall have summary power by vote of a majority of its members, to suspend or expel and terminate the membership of any member for conduct which in its opinion disturbs the order, dignity, business or harmony, or impairs the good name, popularity, good will or prosperity of the organization, or which is likely to endanger the welfare, interest, or character of the organization, or for non-payment of dues, or for any conduct in violation of these By-Laws or of the rules and regulations of the Club which may be taken at any meeting of such board. The proceedings of the Board of Directors in such matters shall be final and conclusive. After the expiration of the time set forth in any suspension by the Board of Directors, the suspended member may petition the Board of Directors for reinstatement. A three-fourths affirmative vote of all members of the Board of Directors present at any regularly called meeting shall be required to pass upon such reinstatement. Life members may be suspended, expelled, or reinstated, in the same manner as other members.

Before any action is taken, Clarence Callier and Frank Petty will be informed by letter of the board's decision to give them the opportunity to write or appear at the next board meeting for an explanation about their behavior.

Horace Wood presented an application and map for a new regional group, The Aloha Mustang and Shelby Club of Hawaii. They were voted on and approved. A motion to adjourn the June meeting was made by Lee Greenfield, seconded by Jack Yeager, and approved.
