And finally, in the 1971-73 fastback class, third place went to Draft Price of Columbia, South Carolina. No first or second was awarded in this class.

Our abject apologies to these winners for these mistakes. We'll certainly do our best to see that such errors don't occur in the future.

Deadlines Decided
