As you have perhaps already noticed, there have been some changes in the staff of the *Mustang Times*, starting with this first issue of 1982.

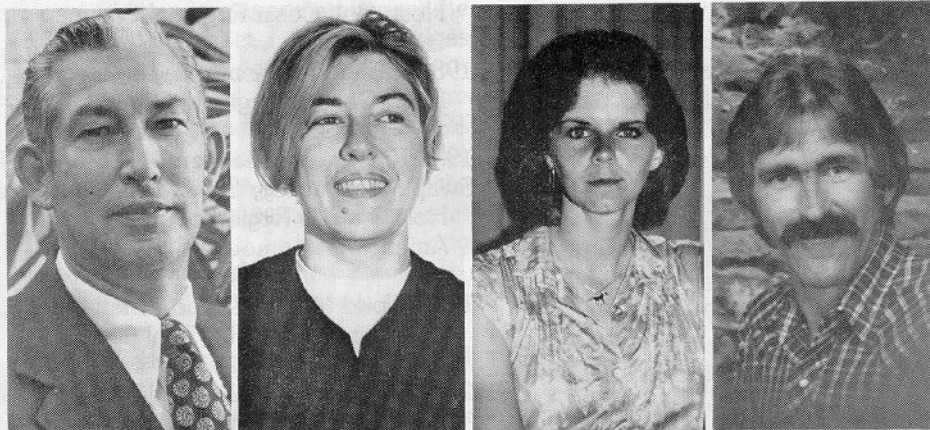
