This 1965 "notchback" 289 2V automatic belongs to new MCA member Dennis Thompson and his wife, Jill, of Auckland, New Zealand. Dennis sends word that his Mustang has its original green paint, has traveled only 53,000 miles, and was imported to New Zealand in 1968. The 1982 winner of the stock section and best interior awards of the New Zealand Mustang Club, the Thompson's Mustang has a "current saleable value in New Zealand of \$13,000, U.S."

"To my knowledge, my car is only one of three 1967 390's in New Zealand having done 100,000 miles," writes Wayne Frew of Taihape, North Island, New Zealand.

When he wrote last, Wayne was in the process of stripping and rebuilding everything, following along with his plans to restore the Mustang to its original state. He is installing a 390 engine he had sent
