MCA's 1982 Eastern National



May 28 . . .

The early gray mists of Friday morning gave no hint that Memorial Day Weekend temperatures would spike into July-like ninety-plus highs.

Members of the Georgia Regional Group mustered early in the parking lot of the Marriott Interstate North. They hurried around, checking last minute details, only half believing that the long awaited, long planned Eastern National Show and Swap Meet was finally here.

Mists cleared, and Mustang noses started to appear. Teresa Vickery, in charge of registration, and Frank White, Show Director, began to welcome fellow Mustangers from all over.

Cars were checked in and parked according to their classes, where they would remain on display for the remainder of the meet. The Pony Corral, headed by Jane Singleton and earmarked for cars that owners' want to sell, began to fill. Head Judge Bob Vickery and his assistant, Jim Osborne, pressed all available judges into service to help with the mind-boggling task of picking winners from 132 nearly perfect Mustangs. Tom Gattis, in charge of Vendors, had his hands full as he helped a record number of goody-laden firms set up.

Around 7:00 PM, everybody stopped work and gathered for what has become the traditional Friday night weenie roast at MCA meets. According to a very reliable source, 700 hot dogs were disposed of, before the group moved inside for door prizes, given out by Gordon Harrison, a loud Western band, and more Mustang camaraderie.

May 29 . . .

The Show began at 7:00 AM Saturday morning, with a registration deadline of 9:00 AM. Bill and Barbara Koivu manned the Pepsi Cola "Wagon" which loomed as a real-life oasis as Saturday sizzled on.

When the judging had been completed, MCA members dressed out in their finest and amassed in the Marriott's Ball Room for the Awards Banquet. After a delightful meal and a few more door prizes, the trophies were awarded by Frank White, Georgia Regional President. It was the high point of the Meet, the moment of truth, this presentation of trophies to those who had won many times and to those who were receiving trophies for the first time. All seemed equally excited and happy.

After dinner, MCA members enjoyed more Mustang talk and fellowship.

May 30 . . .

Sunday morning, the Show began at 10:00. A new feature which helped to dispel the anticlimatic feeling of Sunday afternoon was the drawing at 1:00 PM for the 1969 Mustang Convertible.

This little beauty, which had been lovingly restored by the Georgia Regional Group, brought in a whopping \$7,000 to \$8,000 in raffle tickets. At deadline, the exact total was not known.

Shortly after the drawing, MCA began heading for home. The Marriott Interstate's parking lot was drained of its splendor as the colorful parade of Mustangs made its way toward the Interstate. Once there, the Mustangs and trailers wove their way into Sunday afternoon traffic, and the 1982 Eastern National moved into history.
