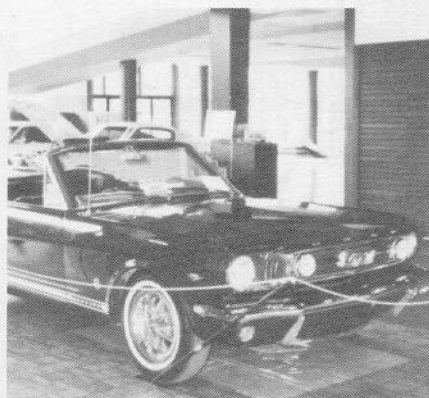

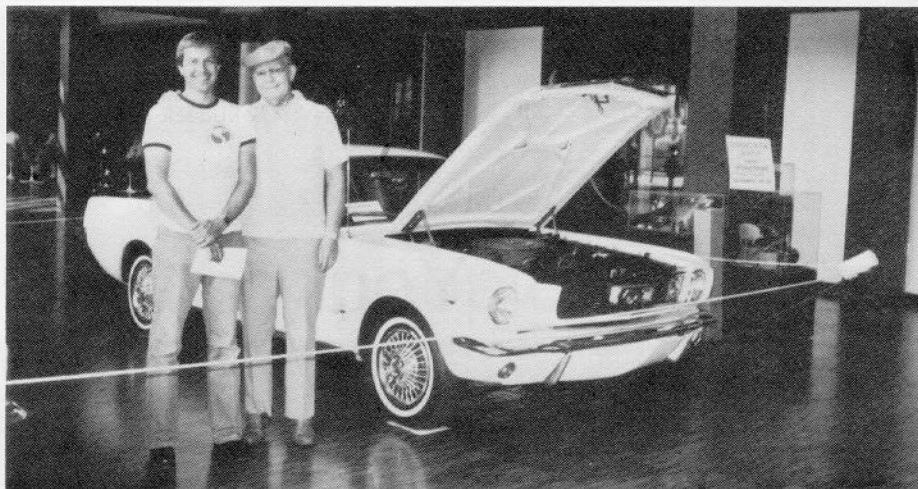
Betty Black has owned this '73 convertible since new, and it got her to work everyday — rain, sleet, or snow. Now it's only driven to Mustang shows.
