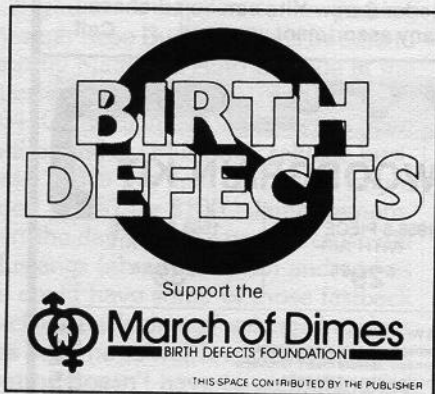

paloosa Horse Club many years before deciding Mustangs keep their stalls much cleaner than Appaloosa's.

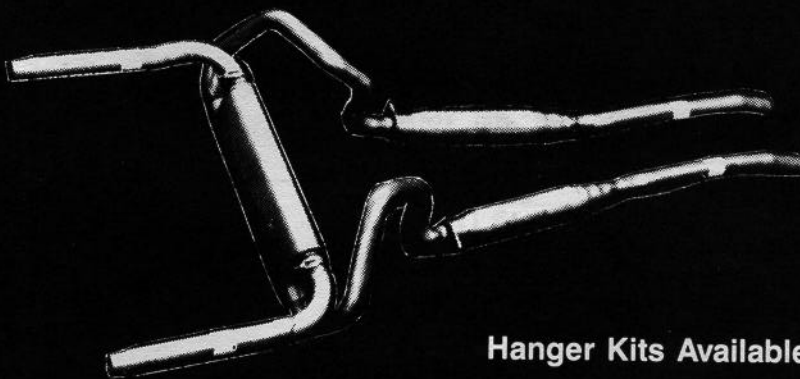
